Dear Mr. President,

The Solar Energy Industries Association (SEIA) is the national trade association of the solar energy industry. We deeply appreciate your strong support of pro-solar policies as well as your decision to install solar photovoltaic and water heating systems at the White House. In part due to policies advanced by the Administration, the U.S. solar market grew 67 percent in 2010 and created approximately 50,000 new jobs.

On behalf of our 1,000 member companies and 100,000 Americans employed by the solar industry, I am writing to respectfully request that you work with Congress to provide additional funding to the Department of Energy (DOE) Loan Guarantee Program. The solar energy industry is one of the fastest-growing industries in the country, doubling the number of workers it employed in the U.S. last year. Yet today that growth has been jeopardized, as the DOE informed dozens of applicants in the Loan Guarantee Program that their project will be put on hold indefinitely.

To date, DOE has committed nearly \$30 billion in loan guarantees for 27 clean energy projects with total project investments of over \$40 billion. Together these projects will create tens of thousands of jobs across 21 states.

The DOE Loan Guarantee Program has achieved several notable successes for solar projects, including the closing of loan guarantees for utility-scale solar power plants in Arizona and California, both of which are currently under construction and employing hundreds of workers. Loan guarantees have also been issued for solar manufacturing facilities in California, Colorado and Indiana. However, there are approximately 40 pending applications that have been placed on hold, representing \$15 billion in clean energy investments and thousands of jobs across the country. These companies have each spent millions of dollars preparing applications and undergoing DOE's due diligence process.

While we appreciate DOE's need to move forward on the projects it believes are most likely to meet the Section 1705 September 30, 2011 deadline, we are concerned that a funding shortfall will prevent many other worthy applications from moving forward. We ask that you call upon Congress to provide sufficient funding to the Section 1703 DOE Loan Guarantee Program in

FY2012 to continue the timely processing and reward of loan guarantees to all of the projects deserving of DOE support.

The Loan Guarantee Program was established to leverage private capital investment in job-creating renewable energy projects. Our collective ability to deploy renewable energy generation, to regain a leadership position in the manufacture of clean energy technologies, and to put people to work today relies on the continued efficacy of this program.
