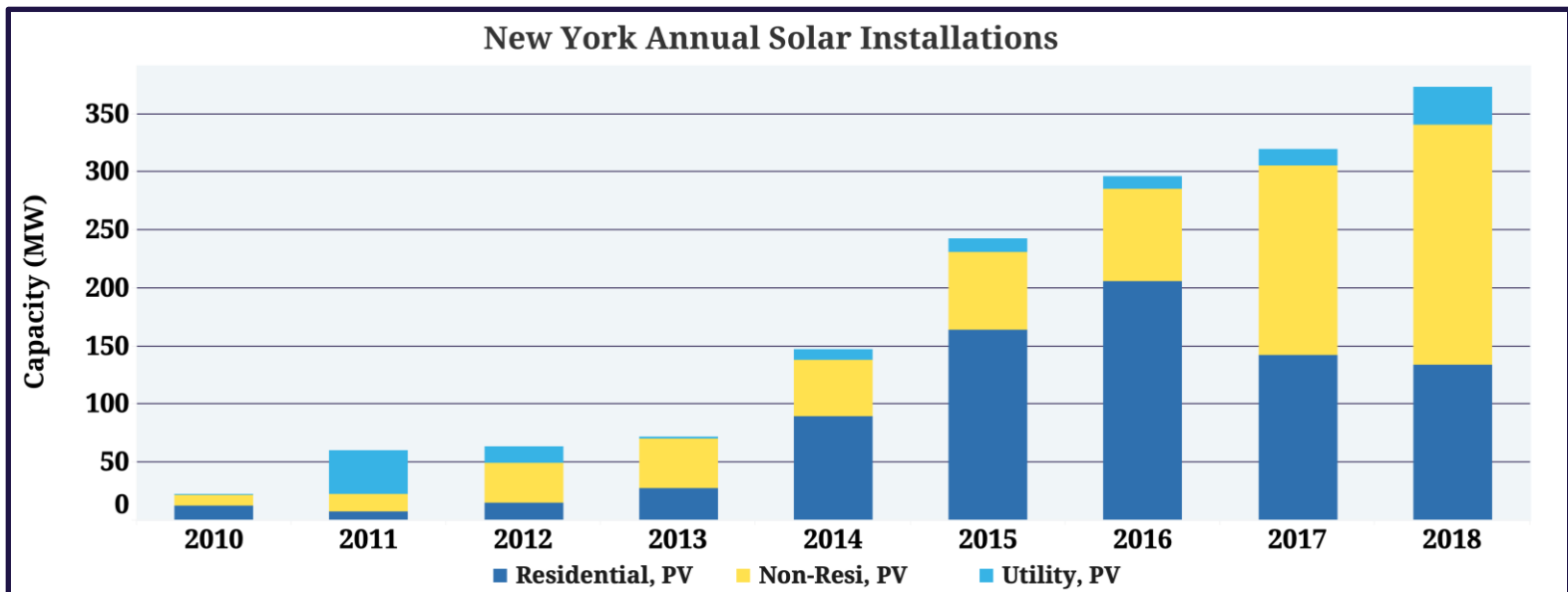


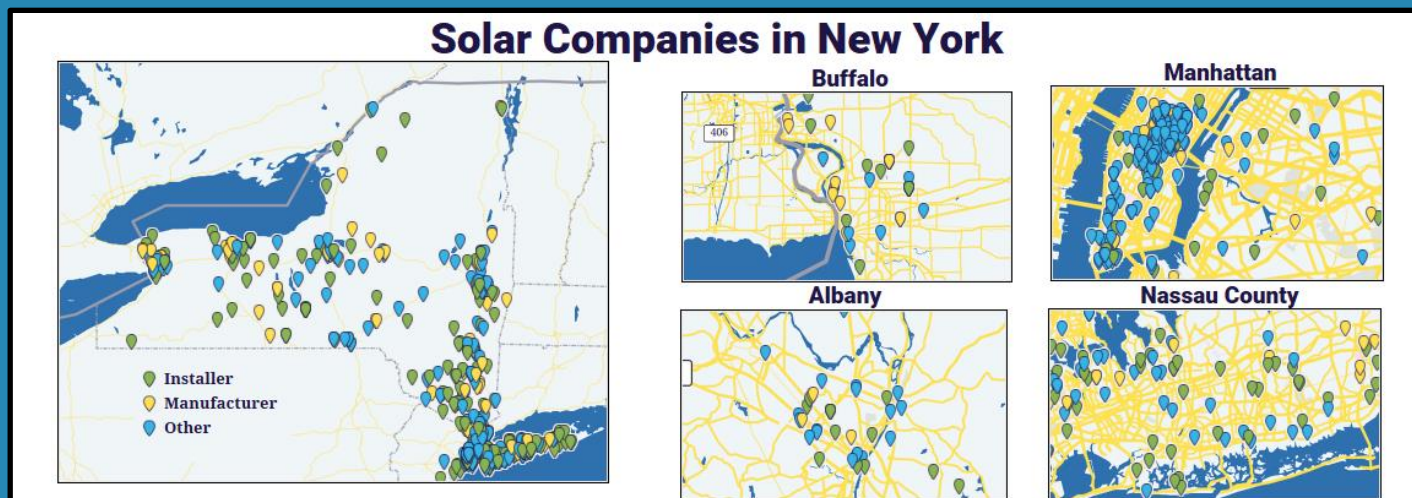
At A Glance

- **Solar Installed:** 1,628.0 MW (372.9 MW in 2018)ⁱ
- **Enough Solar Installed to Power:** 281,000 homes
- **National Ranking:** 10th (6th in 2018)
- **Percentage of State’s Electricity from Solar:** 1.40%ⁱⁱ
- **Solar Jobs and Ranking:** 9,729 (4th in 2018)ⁱⁱⁱ
- **Solar Companies in State:** 858 companies total; 98 Manufacturers, 302 Installers, 458 Others^{iv}
- **Total Solar Investment in State:** \$ 4.69 billion (\$764.64 million in 2018)
- **Price Declines:** 47% over the last 5 years
- **Growth Projections and Ranking:** 3,061 MW over the next 5 years (ranks 6th)



Notable Projects

- Onondaga County- Clearwater was developed by Tesla. This photovoltaic project has the capacity to generate 2.4 MW of electricity -- enough to power over 398 New York homes.^v
- At 2 MW, Onondaga County - Oak Orchard in Clay is among the largest solar installations in New York. Completed in 2017 by Tesla, this photovoltaic project has enough electric capacity to power more than 332 homes.^{vi}
- Owens Corning is one of the first major corporations to go solar in New York with their 2 MW Delmar Insulation Plant project in Feura Bush.^{vii}
